NH Trivia: One hundred million years ago, the area of this mountain range was a very different place. What appear to be individual peaks are actually what is left of a large, now extinct volcano. It is thought that the volcano may have been as high as 10,000 feet, and would have looked something like Mt. Vesuvius or Mt. Fuji. Three major eruptions, each about ten million years apart, changed the volcano into what is seen today. The second eruption, around 90 million years ago, created this famous ring dike.

Weekly Educational Topic - Monadnock Region

The Monadnock Region is a diverse and historic region with some really interesting places to visit. Before I became a GSA, the only thing I knew about the region was that Keene was the prominent city and that my sister lived nearby. I am thankful that through my years with this great organization, I have learned about and experienced some truly wonderful locations and met some of the most dedicated tourism professionals that I feel honored to call my friends. I wanted to share some of my favorite places to tell folks about.



[Cathedral of the Pines](#), Rindge - What a breathtaking and thought-provoking place. The open-air cathedral sits on a hilltop with an impressive view of Grand Monadnock. It's 236 acres contain outdoor meditation chapels, beautiful gardens, and historic monuments to honor the service of American men and women. On their website, you can download a 44 page detailed guide with photos. There is no charge to enjoy the property.

[Stonewall Farm](#), Keene - Stonewall farm is more than an organic farm. They offer a variety of educational programs, a farm store, a beautiful function hall, horse-drawn sleigh rides, farm animals to visit, and guests can explore their hiking & biking trails for free. They are a fantastic place to explore.



[Historical Society of Cheshire County](#), Keene - The society operates a culture heritage center from its two iconic buildings on Keene's Main Street: its headquarters in an 1870 Italianate building at the Ball Mansion, and a period house museum at the Wyman Tavern (built in 1762). Their collections are extensive and exhibits are interesting and well-done.

[Hannah Grimes](#) & [Hannah Grimes Marketplace](#) (celebrating 20 years) - Hannah Grimes provides space, tools, and connections to help local entrepreneurs thrive. Their celebrated Marketplace is a must stop place when you are visiting Keene's beautiful downtown. Inside you can find a wonderful collection of over 1000 local artisans selling products to purchase in their storefront. Many are one-of-a-kind. Perfect for all your gift giving!



[Greater Hillsborough Area Chamber Events](#) - this very involved chamber works with its community on these large events each year. This year, our GSA volunteers, will be able to serve at all of them! So much fun.

[Balloonfest](#) (celebrating 30 years) - hot air balloons, midway, amusement rides, entertainment, car show, 5K race, vendors and more!

[Living History Event](#) (celebrating 10 years) - Held on 4 action-packed sites, LHE is jammed packed with historical entertainment including, but not limited to, battles, skilled actors and historians re-enacting famous people, hands-on and educational children and family activities, an artisans fair, farmer's market, and more...

[Schnitzelfest](#) (celebrating 16 years) - Authentically prepared schnitzel, sauerkraut, potato salad, breads, and delectable desserts served under the tent. NH Beer and wine bar. Craft vendors. Entertainment, including the Zouer Kraut

Bavarian band.

[Monadnock Center for History and Culture](#), Peterborough - The museum features four display rooms with something for every history lover, along with rotating exhibits that explore using objects, documents, and photographs. For their youngest visitors, there is even a Town's Attic, a family-centered space with hands-on activities including quill writing, rag doll making and historic games. On their website, you can find links to their library, research, events, and programs.

[The Colonial Theater](#), Keene (celebrating 93 years) - this historic performing arts center is at the center of the region's cultural and creative spirit. Not only do they have high-end entertainment and films, they also have many educational outreach programs. Visit their site for an impressive list of upcoming shows!

[Madame Sherri Forest](#), Chesterfield - The 488 acres of the Madame Sherri Forest was generously donated for conservation to the Society for the Preservation of New Hampshire Forests by Anne Stokes. The forest is named for the eccentric Madame Antoinette Sherri. The foundation, chimneys and a grand stone staircase from the once magnificent house can be seen adjacent to the Madame Sherri Forest on a side trail close to the entrance off the Gulf Road.



[Harrisville Mills](#), Harrisville - this historic mill district covers about 200 acres and has about 135 structures. A personal favorite spot is Harrisville Designs. They make high-quality, natural 100% wool yarns for knitting and weaving along with carded fleece for felting and spinning. They offer looms of every size and a line of children's products in their store, along with textile artisan workshops and classes. When my daughter was young, there was always something from their shop under the tree from Santa! (photo: Historic Harrisville, Inc)

Beautiful historic inns & restaurants include the [Fitzwilliam Inn](#) & the [Hancock Inn](#). Other favorite places to stay in the region are the [Jack Daniels Motor Inn](#) in Peterborough, and the [Days Inn](#) in Keene.

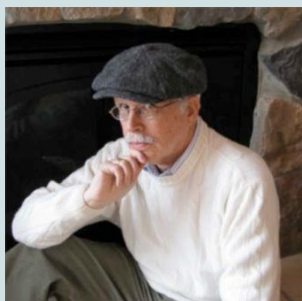


[The Grand Monadnock](#) - a family favorite and considered the most frequently climbed mountain in North America, at 3,165'. There are 40 miles of maintained foot trails and 1000s of acres of protected land on and around the peak.

[Stone Arch Bridge](#), Stoddard - This twin arch structure built without mortar and sustained solely by expert shaping of its archstones is typical of a unique style of bridge construction employed primarily in the Contoocook River Valley in the first half of the Nineteenth Century. It's easily seen off Route 9 and worth a look (and a photo!). [Click here](#) for information on Hillsborough's Stone Arch Bridges.

[Franklin Pierce Homestead](#), Hillsborough - Franklin Pierce Homestead was the home of the 14th president of the United States from his infancy until his marriage in 1834. The Pierce Homestead is a fine example of New Hampshire village architecture. It is a two-story frame building with a hipped roof. Built by Pierce's father in 1804, it reflects the gracious and affluent living of the nineteenth century.

American Roadways and Vacationing With Your Parents So Long Ago

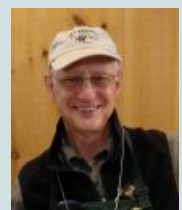

Soon, roadways were built that connected the countryside and small villages to large towns and cities. Photography Tips by GSA Maurice Demers

Shooting photographs in sunshine: Sunny days are great for making photographs. But avoid shooting with the sun behind your subject. If you do, it will fool your camera into thinking there is too much light and the subjects will be under-exposed or dark. Conversely, avoid shooting your subjects with the sun shining into their eyes. It will cause them to squint. Instead, try to have the sun positioned to the side of your subject. This will have the added benefit of producing better detail due to the shadows that result.
